

The Russell Collins Files

These Russell Files consist of images and .PDF files that you can use with the “Paint Your Pet By Numbers” E-Book. You can duplicate them in any way you want but read the book to see what you cannot do. If you haven’t bought the “Paint Your Pet” package, then you can use these files. If you have bought the package, then you can use these to practice with before you move onto your own painting.

These images could be inkjet/deskjet printed or photocopied onto ordinary paper and thin cardstock, acrylic paper, and canvas paper and canvas sheet. Not all printers and photocopiers might be able to deal with the thickness of these papers, but most should. You should be able to use a laser printer as well but **DO NOT** put canvas sheet through a laser printer.

Read the name of the files to tell you what they consist of.

Paint Colours Colour.

The colours of the paints in the 2 sets of paints option, scanned in with colour. Painted by hand. It also shows whether a paint is transparent, opaque or semi.

Paint Colours Monochrome

The colours of the paints in the 2 sets of paints option – as above, this time scanned in as greyscale monochrome. This gives you an idea of “value” in a colour. You can see that different colours, when shown in monochrome, may have the same “value”. Painted by hand.

Your Own Colour Coded Palette

Use this if you want to apply a different colour scheme to the painting, than the one that is supplied. Simply paint into the relevant box, the colour you want to use, and write the name from the tube next to it.
